Taking care of your trombone

- 1) Never tap your mouthpiece into the trombone. Simply put it in the receiver and give a slight twist as you push.
- 2) Remember to use slide lubricant sparingly as needed, and wipe down the inner slide with a damp paper towel if you notice a film or crusty looking build-up on the slide before applying again.
- 3) Remember to lock your slide lock anytime you aren't playing and before putting your trombone in the case.
- 4) Be aware of your surroundings and make sure you have enough space to fully extend your slide before unlocking the lock.
- 5) Never store anything on top of your trombone in the case.

What your maintenance covers:

Once a year hand cleaning

Once a contract Sonic Cleaning

Up to 2 water key corks over the 3 year contract

Stuck mouthpieces

Up to 2 frozen slides removed over the 3 year contract

Minor hand slide alignment as needed
